

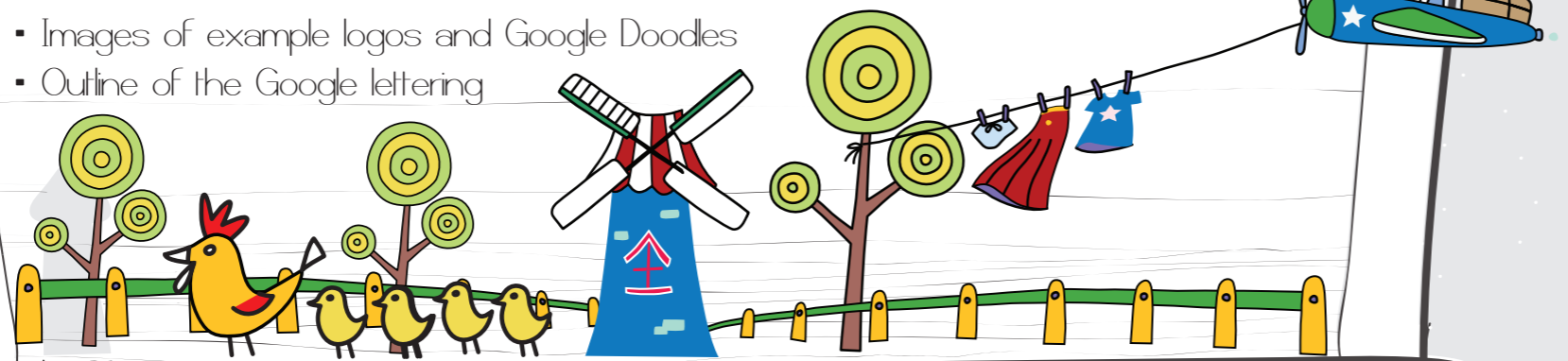

## Materials and equipment recommended

- Paper

- Images of various discoveries and innovations that stemmed from India and positively influenced the world
- Images of things that could help you get ideas or inspire you with respect to India's contributions to the world
- Images of example logos and Google Doodles
- Outline of the Google lettering



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## Tips to help you make the Doodle

- To get to know more about Google, you can visit [www.google.co.in](http://www.google.co.in) and look for 'Google Doodles' to find examples of other doodles that have appeared on the Google homepage
- You can think about what is special about India and appreciated all over the world. You could look at magazines, books or even use the Internet to help you with your ideas
- You can think of different things from India such as Indian art, culture, fables, literature or inventions that have been great contributions made by India to the world
- You can then think about what elements you consider to be the most important gifts that India has made to the world and make them part of your Google doodle
- Print out a few copies of the outline, in case you want to experiment with a few drafts before you make the final one.
- Once the final copy is made, you must explain why you have drawn what you did
- After you have finished your drawing, you must write down a title and a supporting statement. Simply describe what you have drawn in the picture in a few words. Tell us what you think best describes our theme- 'India's gift to the world'
- Remember your title should be no more than 4 to 5 words and your supporting statement should be no more than 100 words
- Also be careful while using the National Flag in the doodle - national symbols like the Ashoka Chakra are not to be used
